

INDUCTION DAYS

We would like to invite your child to an induction day in June. Details of the day your child will attend have been emailed to you.

In order for your child to attend, please could I ask for the following form to be completed by Friday 27th May <https://forms.office.com/r/S8S3wfTtEd>

They will follow a full secondary school day and will have a variety of lessons with a number of different teachers. Students will be expected to bring their own school equipment, e.g. pens, pencils and rulers and will be expected to carry these with them all day so please ensure their bag is adequate for all their belongings and named clearly.

Please can your child wear their primary school uniform and arrive at the front of St Crispin's for an 8.55am start. The day will end at 2:30pm.

On the induction children can buy a school lunch from a wide selection of items available in the restaurant. A main hot meal costs approx. £2.40. For details of all menu items available, along with prices please see our website <http://www.crispins.co.uk/parents/>

They may bring a packed lunch if preferred. Food is also available at break time. If a free school meal is normally taken, the primary school will inform us and your child will receive a meal as usual. Please note the free school meal does not include provision of a drink. Drinks are also available to be purchased and water is available for all students although your child will need to bring a suitable bottle with them.

PARENTS INFORMATION



On Thursday 23rd June, we shall release a series of induction snapshot videos which provide an overview of certain aspects of life at St. Crispin's such as uniform, tracking and reporting, communication and systems. We shall email you directly on the day once these videos have been released. A school information pack will also be emailed which will include a list of uniform and also several important forms that will need to be completed and returned to us before the summer holiday.



TUTOR GROUPS



Those of you that have experienced the induction at St. Crispin's in previous years will be aware that we have in the past released the tutor groups to the students on induction day. In order for us to have a better view and understanding of the best placement for your child, these will be released in July with an email to you for your child which will include some information about their form tutor.



SUMMER SCHOOL



We are delighted to share that in liaison with Wellington College, we are going to put on a teambuilding day during the summer holiday to help students get to know one another and to develop their self-esteem and confidence. I fully appreciate that holidays may have been booked at this stage and therefore apologise in advance if your child is unable to attend. Please rest assured that this is in addition to the usual transition support for students which takes place before and after the summer.

The children will all spend a day at Wellington College on **Thursday 25th August** with coaches provided from St. Crispin's to and forth. I have requested confirmation in the form for induction as to whether your child will be able to attend. Once we have finalised plans for the day, I shall write to you.

SUMMER READING PROJECT



As a school, we are committed to students building their reading fluency, vocabulary acquisition and to get into good reading habits. To instil this from the outset, on the induction day, each student will be given their own copy of a reading book to support them to complete a summer reading project.

We have broken the novel down into fifteen minute segments with each having a video attachment of the story being read to them by myself and the head of year allowing students to read along with us.

Each day after completing the fifteen minutes reading, students will take a quick Microsoft form quiz which will then allow us to allocate merits for their participation in the reading project



CONSENT FOR STUDENTS TO APPEAR IN PHOTOGRAPHS OR VIDEOS



As I am sure you will understand, we occasionally take photographs or videos of the students in school. These images may be used in our school prospectus, printed publications or other marketing material that we produce. Photographs could be used on the school website and intranet, display boards or local and national newspapers/websites/television. We may also make videos for learning and promotional purposes.

As St. Crispin's is an academy and part of The Circle Trust we may also use images or videos of students in our printed publications (such as newsletters and promotional publications), The Circle Trust website, social media or local and national newspapers/websites/television.

In using photographs of students, it is important that we protect your son/daughter's interests, respects and wishes and comply with Data Protection law.

- The consent you give is valid until your son/daughter leaves the school except in the case of newsletters, websites, social media and school prospectus where consent will remain until the images/videos are no longer needed. You may change your mind in relation to any consents that you have provided at any time. This includes withdrawing your consent to anything that you have agreed to. Your consent will automatically expire after this time.
- St. Crispin's / The Circle Trust will not re-use any photographs or recordings of your son/daughter that are incompatible with the original purposes explained to you.
- If we use photographs of individual students, we will not use the full name of that student in any accompanying text or caption without consent, nor will we include any other personal data.
- We may use group or class photographs or footage with very general labels, such as 'Year 6 transition class.'



CONSENT FOR STUDENTS TO APPEAR IN PHOTOGRAPHS OR VIDEOS (CONTINUED)



- Parents/carers should note that websites can be viewed throughout the world and not just in the United Kingdom (where UK law applies) and, when copied from the website, images and information can no longer be controlled by the school.

Where we have taken pictures of your son/daughter, particularly with a professional photographer, we would be more than happy to share these images with you, free of charge.

To provide or decline consent, please complete question 5 of the induction form as requested above.

Please note there are certain activities where we do not use consent as the basis for processing your son/daughter's data. These are described in our Privacy Notices which can be found on the school's website.

We may include taking photos/videos of your son/daughter for identification purposes and for evidencing their educational development – such data will sit on their file and not be shared unless the law requires us to do so or you have given your specific consent.
