GET INTO THE ARMED FORCES!

The Royal Air Force (RAF)

If you want a high-flying career, then you might be interested in the RAF. They defend our skies and also help out with humanitarian aid, disaster relief and search and rescue missions. It's not just for pilots, either – there are roles for ground crew, navigators, maintenance crews and more.

Training opportunities

Your initial training will focus on preparing you – physically and mentally – to take on the challenges and responsibilities of RAF life. This is followed by specialist training in the skills you'll need to do your particular job. After that, there are vocational qualifications available, like NVQs and Apprenticeships, as well as the chance to study for a degree.

Earnings: New recruits earn around $\pounds13,700$ a year, and get paid while they train.

Royal Navy

Despite what you might think, the Royal Navy isn't just about ships. They have submarines, jets, planes and helicopters too – not to mention an ultra-elite Marine Corps. The Royal Navy keep our seas protected and also provides support to other military operations. There are roles both onshore and out at sea.

Training opportunities

You'll start out with basic training that will prepare you for life in the Royal Navy. After that, you'll get specialist training in the skills you'll need to do your chosen job. Along the way, there's the opportunity to gain vocational qualifications like NVQs and Apprenticeships. You could even get a degree while in service.

Earnings: New recruits earn between £13,000 and £14,000 a year, and get paid while they train.

The British Army

The Army carries out tasks given to it by our government. It's main job is to protect our country at home and overseas – soldiers may be deployed on UN operations and used to help in other emergencies. There are lots of branches in the Army, from infantry soldiers to artillery and engineering.

Training opportunities

There are lots of training and education opportunities with the Army, from the day you join and start basic training to career courses where you learn a trade and gain NVQs and HNC qualifications. **Earnings:** New recruits earn between £14,000 and £16,000 a year, and get paid while they train.
